My research centers on understanding the links between stress and health in older adulthood. I am particularly interested in how stress affects the immune system, and how to strengthen stress resilience to promote healthy aging in multiple domains, including cognitive and immune aging. My scientific contributions fall into three areas:

- Implications and remediation of stress, including older family caregivers' stress, for healthy cognitive and immune aging
- The influence of sleep and insomnia on stress physiology, inflammation, and clinical outcomes, including chronic pain, depression, and traumatic stress symptoms
- The role of social relationships in older adults' stress and stress resilience
