

# Post-Master's Certificate in Nursing Education Concentration in Education (PMC-E)

This five-course (18-credit) post-master's certificate program is designed for APRNs (NP's, CNS's, CNL's) who wish to obtain educational courses and skills for practice as an academic or clinical nurse educator. The program must be started in the fall semester and will conclude at the end of the following fall semester. In order to complete the program in four semesters, students must take two courses during either of the fall semesters. First fall semester must start with Warner School of Education course EDU 497. Students must be available for a one day mandatory in class session for EDU 497, typically during the first week in September.
