I am particularly interested in how stress affects the immune system, and how to strengthen stress resilience to promote healthy aging in multiple domains, including cognitive and immune aging. My scientific contributions fall into three areas:

- Dementia prevention through behavioral interventions in those at risk
- The role of social relationships, sleep, and biological aging in stress resilience
