High-dose Vitamin D supplementation for ADT-induced bone loss in older prostate cancer patients.

<u>Major Goal</u>: The purpose of this trial is to determine if high-dose Vitamin D supplementation is effective at decreasing the loss of bone mineral density in older men with prostate cancer receiving androgen deprivation therapy.
