Title: Partnering to Advance Psycho-Oncology Services for Underrepresented Adolescents and Young Adults with Cancer

We will utilize a transdisciplinary approach to enhance a national research infrastructure through the AYA Cancer REsearch (AYA CARES) program at the University of Michigan, Ann Arbor, Michigan (U-M). We will engage in a series of stakeholder-centered activities for the purposes of conceptualizing, developing, and disseminating Comparative Effectiveness Research (CER)/ Patient-Centered Outcomes Research (PCOR) studies that capitalize on the collaborative efforts, experiences, and brainpower of (embodied) researchers, clinicians, AYA cancer survivors, caregivers, program administrators, and other stakeholders. Our overall objective is to cultivate our nascent research infrastructure and build capacity for conducting PCOR/CER that is inclusive and equitable in terms of enhancing opportunities for participation by AYA cancer survivors who identify as Black, Indigenous, and People of Color (BIPOC) and/or sexual and gender minorities (SGM). Specific aims are to: 1) Identify strategies for recruiting, engaging, and retaining underrepresented AYA cancer survivors in PCOR and CER; and 2) Develop and implement mechanisms for dissemination through a broad network of stakeholders who are invested in care delivery, research, and advocacy for AYAs affected by cancer. The project will include four components: 1) Pre-Implementation; 2) Phase I: Needs assessment with stakeholders through qualitative interviews; 3) Phase II: One-day national symposium with a broad network of stakeholders; one-day symposium for further stakeholder engagement and initial dissemination; and 4) Dissemination of project findings in collaboration with project partners and advisory board members.

Title: Patient-centered Outcomes of Prior Authorization for Long-acting Opioids

The objective of the proposed work is to understand the consequences of the prior authorization process among patients who are prescribed opioids at MSKCC. The research team is comprised of experts in health services research, pain management, and cancer-related financial hardship and includes a doctorally-prepared cancer survivor. Findings from our study will 1) help identify appropriate outcome metrics for a larger study of prior authorization impacts on pain management in a broader, more diverse setting; 2) inform expansion of this research to other aspects of cancer treatment that frequently require prior authorization (e.g., imaging, radiation); 3) aid in the development of policy recommendations for hospital systems optimize care delivery in the context of prior authorization.

Title: Enhancing Health Cost Literacy and Financial Capability Among Young Adult Cancer Survivors

The study aims to address financial toxicity and subsequent financial barriers to survivorship care by developing and pilot-testing a health cost literacy and financial capability intervention with a national sample of young adult survivors. Using mixed methodology, the intervention will be guided by the Developmental Model of Financial Capability and developed in consultation with survivors of young adult cancer, clinical experts, and a non-profit organization dedicated to reducing financial toxicity in cancer survivors. I will contribute my expertise as a young adult cancer survivor and researcher in financial toxicity, and assist with intervention development, and dissemination of study findings.

The purpose of this study is to identify and define functional genomic pathways through which current and past psychosocial and social environmental risk and resilience factors influence gene regulation in AYAs, and thus contribute to a greater understanding of health disparities in post-treatment survivorship. Using repeated measures of risk and resilience factors and blood assays, we will evaluate the extent to which biological, psychological, and social indicators are associated with, and potentially predict, mortality and morbidity in AYA cancer survivors within two years following completion of therapy.
